



## Ministering to Those with Disabilities

Get to know the individual  
*as a person,*  
separate from their disability.

Don't ignore someone  
with a disability.

Offering to spend  
time with disabled  
children can give  
parents a break to  
focus on other  
children or take  
care of other needs.

Help can be given  
even when you  
can't be there in  
person. Notes of  
*encouragement* or  
a friendly voice  
can mean a lot.

Speak to them in a way  
you would speak to  
others their age.  
*Show respect* through  
your tone of voice and  
actions. Speak  
to them directly.

For younger individuals with disabilities, saying  
things like "Tell me more about David" allows the  
family to share what they are comfortable with.
